Forklift License Ottawa - In North America, getting a forklift license or forklift certification involves hands-on and classroom training. Regulatory control over training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of federal, state and provincial groups. Operators could get a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. Regardless, regulatory requirements must be met. Recertification is needed every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial equipment that is designed together with different options, like for example stand-up and sit down models, electric and propane versions, and various sizes and types to meet the industrial requirements of employees. Operator training programs are often individualized to deal with the specific types and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down forklift in a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered lift truck within a shipyard. The various lift trucks and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machinery and industries. Regulatory standards, thus, have a tendency not to focus on detailed course requirements but rather on the outcome of individual training courses.

On the job training which is provided by the employer is the most common way of forklift training licensing and certification. The employer who offers this method of certification is needed to provide practical training and classroom sessions on equipment at their place of work. Employers could choose to train workers on each kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machines combined. The program incorporates forklift operation procedures, lift truck maintenance, safety procedures and company rules. Topics specific to the worksite, such as hazardous conditions or materials, must be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and use every kind of lift truck on the worksite.

When utilizing a third party trainer, the certification process will typically consist of an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

Typically, an employer-provided certification would not transfer from the present employer to the next employer. Obtaining a forklift license through employer-provided training permits the operator to operate a lift truck for that particular employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an important aspect of the lift truck license training, although the particulars of the safety training will be dependent upon the machinery being utilized. Certain safety issues would differ for every industry and employer. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to deal with extra requirements for safety training in applicable industries, such as in offshore and marine operations.
